Truth be told, my favorite place to read is standing at the end of the dock of a cottage we rent—In the water!! Then, when we get home, I stand in my pool to read.


Where is your favorite place?? A treehouse? A hammock? In the top bunk? I am curious about where you like to read! Write it on the log to be turned in the first day of school.
