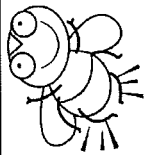




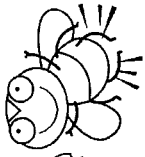
## 2023-2024 Third Grade Supply List

- 1 Two Pack of paper towels
























# 's Summer Reading Challenge
